Michael Gene Sullivan (he/him) (Head Writer, SFMT Collective) has performed with all four of the Bay Area's Tony award-winning theaters: American Conservatory Theater, Berkeley Repertory Theater, Theatreworks, and the San Francisco Mime Troupe (where he is also a Collective Member, director, and as Resident Playwright has written or co-written over 25 plays). Keiko Shimosato Carreiro (she/they) (Actor, SFMT Collecitve) is a Collective and Board Member with the Tony Award-winning San Francisco Mime Troupe. Since 1987, she has been an actor, designer, co-writer, and director with the company and has been in almost every summer show. Will Durkee (he/him) (Musician) is an artist driven by an obsession with colorful, stylized and visually stimulating artwork, as well as an eclectic variety of music. The creation of these art forms has possessed him from an early age, and it is this amalgamation of interests that led Will to focus on his current project: Will Durkee 7ams. Born and raised in the San Francisco Bay Area, Will splits his time between the Sonoma and Sacramento areas of Northern California and travels all over the bay working on an assortment of projects. In the fall of 2015 Will began building a double neck guitar with bass and guitar necks. It was completed in the spring of 2016 and features hand painted/custom art all over the body. The completion of this instrument led him to the opportunity of joining the 2016 summer season of the San Francisco Mime Troupe, a 60-year old musical theater and political satire group. Playing bass and guitar in the band with the double-neck, he toured with them for 3 months playing about 40 shows all across Northern California. In the following summer of 2017, Will created his first mural alongside friend and artist Marcus Lee. They were selected as a group of 6 artists to create a series 30-foot tall murals in the Lower Nob Hill area of San Francisco. Their mural was inspired by Golden Gate Park and took about 3 months to complete. Since then, Will has gone on to continue creating public artwork, including several indoor & outdoor murals, school buses, and three public art pianos. Will has been working as a face painter at the Bay Area Discovery Museum in Sausalito since Since 2017.
